




LET'S LEARN MAGNETIC CHIPS

Adventures With Pip the Pup







Hi, I'm Pip the Pup. I am so excited to teach you how to use magnetic letter chips for learning.




Magnetic letter chips are tools we use at school. They are for learning; they are not toys.




The letter chips are magnetic, which means they stick to our tools. We use a magnetic bingo wand to help us pick them up.




**When my teacher calls out
a letter, I listen carefully.
She might say, “Find the
letter ‘a.’”**




I search for the letter given by my teacher. When I see it, I zap it with my magnetic wand and pick it up.



We can use the chips to build words. If we build the word “dog,” we grab “d,” “o,” and “g.”



After we build the word, we swipe under it with the magnetic wand. We blend the sounds together and read the word: dog.



When finished, we put the magnetic letter chips away neatly. I use magnetic letter chips the right way so everyone can learn.



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
